InterNational High Point Program

It is understood and agreed, due to varying differences of the Tennessee Walking Horse breed created within the various continents and governments throughout the world which regulate and govern the showing and exhibition of horses, there will be some unique differences which dictate separate categories be made within some of the divisions and unique to each National Program.

The TWHBEA InterNational High Point Program will originally be made up of the following Programs:

Canadian

European

United States

At such point where the growth of showing the Tennessee Walking Horse warrants a new National Program be created for a specific global area, this will be promptly addressed by the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee with its recommendations forwarded to the TWHBEA Horse Show Committee for the appropriate discussion and action. However, the categories within each National Program Divisions shall be the same or similar where possible.

PROGRAM'S PURPOSE :

To Honor and Reward the Registered Tennessee Walking Horse across the world, who through competitive, successful showing throughout the year, exemplify the varied abilities, talent and stamina of this great breed.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR PARTICIPATION ~ OWNER:

Participation in the TWHBEA InterNational High Point Program is open to all TWHBEA members in good standing. The Owner(s) **MUST** be a TWHBEA member in good standing for qualified participation so that the qualified horse might acquire and accumulate points in the program. Youth participants must be a member in good standing of the TWHBEA or TWHYA. If a horse is registered as having more than one owner, **all** owners **MUST** be TWHBEA members in good standing in order for High Points to be applied to the horse.

If any one's membership lapses during the program, but the member's dues/fees are paid and recorded in the office within 30 days of the expiration date, all points acquired during this 30 day grace period shall be counted. However, after this 30 day time period has expired and dues/fees have not been paid, additional points will not be accumulated again in the program until the delinquent member has paid all fees owed and is once again a member in good standing. Points lost during the lapsed period will not be added into the InterNational High Point Program; only tabulated points while all parties' memberships are in good standing will be counted. If any one's membership expires during October or November all dues/fees must be paid by the last day of October in order for an award to be given, otherwise the award will be forfeited and the runner up, etc. will be granted the award. **No** award will be granted to any horse if the owner(s) is no longer a TWHBEA or TWHYA member in good standing.

It is the sole responsibility of each member / participant to keep their TWHBEA / TWHYA membership in a good standing status for points to be acquired.

Points begin accumulating in the Program from the time the TWHBEA / TWHYA membership fee(s) and/or any outstanding fees have been paid in full.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR PARTICIPATION ~ HORSE:

All equine participants must be registered Tennessee Walking Horses in the TWHBEA registry. Owners are reminded to have their weanlings and yearlings parentage verified as soon as possible, without untimely delays. Beginning in 2012, all 2 and 3 yr. olds **MUST** have fulfilled parentage verification to be qualified to participate in the TWHBEA National Futurity programs, the TWHBEA InterNational High Point Program and any other TWHBEA sanctioned program or events.

The qualified horse shall be owned by a TWHBEA member(s) in good standing in order for points to be tabulated in the InterNational High Point Program.

The qualified horse must be entered on the horse show's entry sheet in their full/correct registered name, including the correct registration number, with the current owner's or owners' names, as well as all other required information.

Failure to correctly enter a horse in a class on the class sheet will result in no points for that class being applied or counted toward a High Point Award!

SALE OF A HORSE:

If a qualified owner sells a qualified horse, the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee will be notified immediately as a result of the TWHBEA transfer policy and requirements. Points that applied to the horse under the previous qualified owner will continue without any lapse or delay in acquiring points under the new ownership contingent on the date the horse is sold, the date of the transfer, if the transfer is properly completed within the required 30 days, and whether or not the new owner(s) is a TWHBEA member in good standing, or until all the participating parties involved with the new ownership have become TWHBEA or TWHYA members in good standing. (*see Qualifications for Participation ~ Owner; Horse*) All transfers of sales **MUST** be done within 30 days of the sale before further points will be acquired and accumulated by the qualified horse.

For example:

- a qualified horse is sold by a qualified owner to a non -TWHBEA member owner. The qualified horse must have its registration papers properly transferred with TWHBEA within 30 days, **and** the new owner(s) must become a TWHBEA member in good standing before any points will continue to be accumulated in the Program.
- a qualified horse is sold by a qualified owner to a TWHBEA owner who is a member in good standing; The registration papers must be properly transferred with TWHBEA within 30 days in order for points to continue accumulating in the Program.

A LEASE SITUATION:

All Lease transactions **MUST BE** in order and on Record, with the Lease fee paid in the TWHBEA office, before a lease transaction is recognized and points can be acquired in the Program. The individual leasing the horse **MUST BE** a TWHBEA or TWHYA member in good standing in order for points to be acquired and accumulated. The original/actual owner (lessor) on record for the horse **MUST BE** and **MUST REMAIN** a TWHBEA member in good standing in order for points to be acquired and accumulated throughout the lease term.

It is the sole Responsibility of All Parties involved in a Lease Transaction to see that All Parties are TWHBEA/TWHYA members in good standing and that the Lease Transaction has been properly filed and on record in the TWHBEA office with all fees paid in order for the proper Qualifications to be met for participation or continued participation in the InterNational High Point Program.

PROGRAM ENTRY:

Every TWHBEA registered horse entered in a show, other events or competitions, and owned by a TWHBEA / TWHYA member or members in good standing, is eligible to participate in the program. In the Equitation Division points are acquired by the Exhibitor who must be a TWHBEA / TWHYA member in good standing, while the Owner(s) of the horse is also a TWHBEA / TWHYA member in good standing.

PROGRAM ENTRIES & THEIR CATEGORIES :

Unless otherwise noted, all National Programs will have the same categories for which a horse is eligible to receive a year end award. All entries will be categorized appropriately. Initially the number of categories in which an award will be given will be narrow in size as entries may be combined in a category. *For example: stock seat equitation may have adults & youth combined for a single stock seat equitation award.* However, when any category has participation numbers warranting either a separation of categories or in a case where fewer numbers justify the combining of categories, the appropriate action will be taken at the discretion of the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee of the TWHBEA Horse Show Committee. Points acquired in specific classes will be noted and counted in the appropriate division and category. High Point information will be available online on the TWHBEA website, www.twhbea.com, under the TWHBEA InterNational High Point Program and periodically in the VOICE and other media.

EXAMPLES: High Points for categories with Championship classes shall be tabulated in their respective categories until qualified participation in the program grows to warrant a separate category for "Championship" entries.

Classes with the description of "2 Gait" shall be the "same as" Specialty and points shall be tabulated in that same category.

Classes with the description of "3 Gait" shall be the "same as" Canter and points shall be tabulated in that same category.

Weanling colts and fillies will be combined into one category, "Weanlings" until qualified participation increases in the program.

Yearling colts and fillies will be combined into one category, "Yearlings" until qualified participation increases in the program.

PROGRAM COMMUNICATION :

The VOICE magazine, and the TWHBEA website will serve as the official lines of communication for the InterNational High Point Program. English shall be the official language recognized and used in all communications. If it becomes overwhelmingly necessary, the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee will work with the TWHBEA International Committee to request and utilize TWHBEA International member volunteers from the membership in the specific desired language to provide whatever translations are needed. However, it shall not be the responsibility of the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee or the TWHBEA Horse Show Committee to see that this requested translation is in fact completed/finished or that the translation(s) is accurate in wording, verbiage, etc..

It will be the sole discretion of the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee to determine the appropriate tabulation of uncertain type classifications of entries. However, be assured the Sub-Committee will be in contact with designated BOD or TWHBEA members in those specific locations and programs to better help determine the best tabulation of points if such a situation does arise.

If there is any concern on the part of a qualified TWHBEA High Point Program participant regarding point tabulation, an email may be sent to the attention of the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee through the TWHBEA website and the matter will be reviewed. However, the Sub-Committee's review and subsequent follow-up decision on the tabulation of the entry shall be final. Their decision will be promptly forwarded to the member through email. *Note ~ the Sub-Committee cannot and will not be responsible for emails not received on either end due to restrictions such as spam type filtering of email servers.*

QUALIFIED EARNED HIGH POINTS :

Qualified participation "points" will be awarded to qualified horses owned by qualified owners participating in the Program. The InterNational High Point Program is intended to recognize the TWHBEA Registered horse and the TWHBEA/TWHYA Owner(s) in good standing, for their work, fulfillment and enjoyment of showing their horses in competitive events of all aspects and the various disciplines of the Tennessee Walking Horse. The accumulation of points in the Program is intended to be done in a fair and equal as is possible method, rewarding the quality of one's competition to the fullest extent possible within and across the National Programs. This program is not intended to be bound by any HIO or other organizational frameworks or personal opinions. Points are transferable if the qualified horse is sold and the required qualifications are met by all parties. All show placings received on official entry sheet copies will also be posted in the horse's individual show record.

ACQUIRING HIGH POINTS:

In order to acquire Points:

- there **must be** at least one Walking Horse class in a show, competition or event
- **an official copy of the horse show schedule or competition, and the entry sheets of the competition/event must be sent to the TWHBEA home office in Lewisburg in order that the proper recording of results can be made in both the horse's individual show record and in the InterNational High Point Program as a qualified participating horse in the program.**



The InterNational High Point Sub-Committee, Horse Show Committee nor TWHBEA will be responsible if points are not acquired for a particular show due to the official copy of all entry sheets for all the Walking Horse classes in the horse show or event not being received.

Note: If a qualified participating horse is excused from the show ring or competition at the request of the exhibitor, judge, ringmaster or any other member of show management, or is disqualified from the competition/event for any reason, **NO** points will be acquired or applied to the horse in the Program for that specific class or event.

Points will be applied as follows:

1. Points will be awarded in accordance to its placing with the number of horses in the class in which the horse /exhibitor is showing or competing.
2. Points in all horse shows/competitions/events will be single points only.
3. Each qualified Horse (*Exhibitor in equitation*) will acquire / accumulate points.
4. If a class is listed on the show schedule as being a combined class such as Youth and Amateur or Amateur and Open combined, points will be applied in the appropriate age or status category in which the Exhibitor/ Horse team normally competes.
5. In cases of a tie, the qualified horse that has the highest percentage of placings overall in the category will determine the winner of the tie.

EXAMPLES of how points will be calculated:

🏆 A horse shows at the NC State Championship in a class of 15 horses. The horse places 6th. The horse acquires 10 points.

🏆 The horse shows at an all walking horse show in a class of 3 horses. The horse places 3rd. The horse receives 1 point.

🏆 A horse is the sole entry in a class at a multi-breed show. The horse receives 1 point.

🏆 At the present time, No points will be acquired for participation in and of itself.

PROGRAM ANNUAL TIME FRAME :

The Program begins November 1st and ends October 31st of the following calendar year, excluding the initial year of the program which begins January 1, 2012 and ends October 31, 2012 or as noted in "*Qualifications for Participation*". Final tabulations will be done *AFTER* October 31st. Points acquired for shows or competitive events after October 31st of a calendar year will be forwarded and applied to the upcoming year's program points. Points will **ONLY** be counted for qualified horses with TWHBEA/TWHYA owner participants with memberships in good standing

END OF THE YEAR AWARDS!

Awards will be presented to High Point Winners of the InterNational High Point Program in December during the TWHBEA Annual Award Banquet or the European and Canadian Annual Banquets. The exact Date and Banquet locations will be announced in the VOICE and online on the TWHBEA website. Notification will be sent to the top winners for their possible attendance to receive their horse's award. Any participant unable to attend the respective Banquet, as well as all other participant awards, will be mailed/shipped their award(s) within fourteen business days after the banquet to the address noted in the registry files as belonging to the current owner of the registered TWHBEA winning horse.



NATIONAL PROGRAMS

The qualified horse and qualified owner(s) are participants in the National Program in which the show/competition/event takes place in order to acquire and accumulate points as well as record those results in the horse's show record.

A qualified TWHBEA member who is a resident of one program, such as Canada, but has a horse that is stabled and shown in the United States, will acquire points for that specific horse in the United States program, not Canada, since the shows where the points have been acquired are in the United States. Likewise a qualified TWHBEA horse owned by a qualified TWHBEA member who is a resident of say the United States, but has a horse compete in European shows, points will be acquired in the European program, not the United States, etc.

CATEGORIES:

During the initial years of the InterNational High Point Program there will be fewer categories in which awards will be given. It will be at the discretion of the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee to combine or separate categories as they see qualified participation warrants. However, as the program grows and qualified participation increases, more individual categories will be added or expanded. Classes will fall under categories as referred to in “*Program Entries & Their Categories*”.

The names of some categories will vary slightly within the three National Programs however, the classifications, gait and judging standards will be the same in each program to the fullest extent possible.



TWHBEA must receive the complete horse show results, listing all entries in each Walking Horse class in order that points can be counted!
(see pg.5 of "Qualified Earned High Points")

TWHBEA has contacted various HIOs and other organizations requesting to receive copies of horse show results. Unfortunately not all have responded. The TWHBEA Horse Show Committee needs and requests the assistance of all participants in the Program, urging HIOs, organizations and horse shows/competitions/events to send a complete official copy of their horse show results to TWHBEA in order that the acquired points can be calculated in the program and recorded in the horse's record.

Due to the differences in the show and competition TWH population throughout the U.S., the distance exhibitors must travel to events in regions, and other variables such as different shoeing regulations within the HIO systems, the U.S. Program will have differences from the other two Programs in the Pleasure Division which are to be understood and accepted by participants in the other two Programs of the TWHBEA InterNational High Point Program and as might be applicable within the U.S. Program.

It will be at the discretion of the InterNational High Point Program Sub-Committee, to determine the appropriate category for recording and placing the acquired points. It **must be** understood and accepted by every qualified participant in the United States Program, due to different shoe sizes, weight, etc. permitted across the many HIO and organization programs, a sincere and earnest effort will be made to accurately record and place the acquired points in the appropriate category's classification. Designated BOD and TWHBEA members within the numerous affiliating and sponsoring programs will be contacted when necessary to better understand and clarify a class description so the most accurate classifying, recording and placing of the acquired points can be made.

(This Versatility division is NOT part of the TWHBEA Pleasure Horse Supreme Versatility Program. Points acquired in the InterNational High Point program DO NOT count toward points in the Supreme Versatility Program.)

The InterNational High Point Program's Versatility Division is in NO way intended to compete with nor in any way diminish the importance of the Supreme Versatility Program or the distinguished accomplishments of those TWHBEA horses, breeders, owners and exhibitors that participate in the Supreme Versatility Program. The InterNational High Point Program Versatility division is meant to fill a void for those TWHBEA members with Versatility horses who, for whatever reasons or circumstances are unable to participate in the requirements of the Pleasure Horse's Supreme Versatility Program.

The names of classes listed under each category are not limited to those alone, but are simply meant to serve as class examples.



TIMED SPEED EVENTS:

Barrels, Youth / Adult; Pole Bending, Youth / Adult;

Water Glass, Youth / Adult; Egg & Spoon, Youth / Adult

Amateur Owned & Trained by definition is that of a horse **owned and trained by** an individual or individuals (*related or not*) that are **not** licensed, certified and or registered "professionals" in any manner. An Amateur Owned & Trained status individual(s) may in fact receive some remuneration for horses, such as *boarding* other individual's horses or as a certified riding instructor. They **DO NOT** receive ongoing remuneration for the daily training of any other person's horse or horses as a "professional" trainer. **They DO NOT earn their living or the majority of their living in this manner.** All training of the horse is to be done by owner exhibitor individual(s) for their own personal satisfaction and the enjoyment of training and exhibiting their personal horse(s) themselves. Amateur Trained & Owned might best describe this division. However, it is traditionally known as AOT.

The AO&T horse is **NOT to have had any "professional" training within 90 days** of participation in an AO&T class for points to be acquired in the program. The same qualifications apply as with all other participants.

End of the Year award tabulations will be final.

No award will be granted to a qualified horse if its owner(s) is not a TWHBEA / TWHYA member in good standing. In such case, the next qualified horse with a qualified owner(s) would be granted the award, etc.
